The Celebration

The JCPenney contribution to our country's two-hundredth anniversary is The Bicentennial Musical Celebration---100 minutes of music for the 4½ million young performers in our high schools and colleges to sing and play for all their audiences.

The Celebration is being offered as a gift to the 30,000 schools in all 50 states and Puerto Rico that have bands, orchestras and choral groups. It is for your use, in any way or form you wish, in your school programs and community activities throughout the Bicentennial Year, and thereafter. There are no conditions, costs, or restrictions.

The program has received a Certificate of Recognition from the American Revolution Bicentennial Administration, making the music part of America's official birthday party.

The Celebration consists of some 70 minutes of historic American music spanning our 200 years, and five newly-commissioned contemporary works on the Bicentennial theme—all specially arranged, edited and printed for this purpose.

The early tunes and songs have been chosen not only for their musical value and historical significance, but also as music which would not otherwise be available at all. The Celebration omits music you are liable to have now or could readily obtain.

The new works are by Roger Nixon (concert band), Norman Dello Joio (chorus), Mitch Leigh (chorus with band and orchestra), David N. Baker (stage band) and Adolphus Hailstork (orchestra).

Three eminent musician-historians prepared the Celebration. Dr. Richard Franko Goldman, president of Peabody Institute in Baltimore and conductor of the Goldman Band, directed the project and programmed the selections for band. Dr. Leonard dePaur of Lincoln Center in New York was programmer of the choral music, and the orchestra works were the responsibility of the late Thor Johnson, conductor of the Nashville Symphony.

An Advisory Board of music educators and authorities contributed actively to the quality and integrity of the program. Many professional organizations were consulted, notably the Music Educators National Conference.

The Celebration music is in the form of complete band sets, orchestra sets, and choral books (30 books to the package). Each category may be requested separately. Selections listed here as being arranged for all three categories are included in all three types of packages. The packages are complete as received — JCPenney cannot, unfortunately, undertake to supply additional instrumental parts, or single selections.

All the music has been edited and arranged with student performance in mind and for a range of skill levels. The "median" is a proficient high school band, orchestra or chorus. But every high school group is likely to find at least some music it can perform well perhaps with a little extra effort—and there is music the university organization will find challenging.

It's not a concert, but...

The Bicentennial Musical Celebration is a collection of music for you to play and sing and enjoy in any way you choose---in whole or in part, in any sequence, on any occasion, in combination with any other music.

It is there to be useful and stimulating and fun-at your discretion.

The Celebration music can indeed be played as a concert if you wish. There is enough music, enough diversity, enough opportunity for good concert pacing and programming. If all three types of performance are included band, orchestra, chorus—there is more music than you will normally use on one occasion.

In any case, how you perform the music in the Celebration is altogether up to you. Piece by piece, as a concert, or as most of a program—however you use it from one time to another, we believe it will add significance, enjoyment and just plain good music to your program.

Are there any restrictions?

No. There are no restrictions attached to this music. Use it when and where and how you wish, without cost or qualification of any kind (and that includes the JCPenney copyright that appears in all the appropriate places) and in any way that meets your own requirements and the size and composition of your group.

Additional music.

If you have only part of the Bicentennial Musical Celebration and wish now to obtain other sections, please feel free to order what you want. So long as the supply lasts, JCPenney will be happy to provide it as a gift to you and your school and your students. (And to non-school groups as well.)

However, JCPenney is not able to supply extra parts or scores, or individual band or orchestra sets. (After January 1, 1976, it may be possible to supply individual choral books from the Celebration sets; it may also be possible to duplicate sections originally ordered and delivered.)

Celebration identity.

The Bicentennial Musical Celebration is a collection of music with a coherent theme and purpose—almost a little library in its own right. We hope you will find it convenient to keep the music together in its special containers, perhaps as the nucleus of a special historical collection of your own that you will add to from various sources through the years.

By the same token, we hope that in preparing your program notes or announcements involving any of this music, you will find it appropriate to credit the piece to the Bicentennial Musical Celebration.

About those slides.

One of the works commissioned for the Celebration by JCPenney is "The Dream Is America" by Mitch Leigh, composer of "Man of La Mancha." It is the theme song of the Celebration, as it were—a delightful piece, easy to learn in the audience and easy to sing, with words that surely touch a common and deeply-felt chord. It is a fine piece with which to close a program—even after "The Stars and Stripes Forever" —particularly if you invite audience participation.

To make that easier and more practical, we have included two lyric slides (it takes two) for auditorium or theater projection.

The other two slides contain thematic art which you may find useful in many ways. They can be used for projection during a performance, as a back-drop or on a proscenium curtain. They can be used for decor projection almost anywhere. Or they can be traced on a wall and executed in black and white or any color scheme for permanent decoration. In smaller tracings, they can provide art for posters, programs, and any other graphics.

Or they can spark equally effective artistry of your own.

Music for marching.

The band music section of the Bicentennial Musical Celebration is intended primarily for performance by concert bands. There may well be times, however, at a civic ceremony or between halves on the football field, when a Bicentennial-oriented selection is called for. Two of the Celebration selections—"Major General U. S. Grant's Grand March" by Joseph Gung'l and "The Gold Bug" by Victor Herbert have been prepared in lyre format. Parts are included for instruments you're hardly likely to carry in a parade —they're there, of course, for your more usual concert occasions.

Performance notes.

Billings' "America," Bloch's "Anthem," Leigh's "The Dream Is America."

These three works have all been arranged for all three performing groups—band, chorus, orchestra—in any combination you may choose for your program. The Billings piece is a fine program opener. The Bloch work is appropriate anywhere—perhaps to create a graceful bridge from or to the chorus in the middle of the typical three-element high school concert.

A band-chorus-orchestra rendition of "The Dream Is America"—with audience participation—would be a stirring program finale indeed.

The Bloch unison line and Billings choral arrangement are included in this book for those who do not have the choral section of the Celebration. The Billings choral arrangement also serves as the conductor's score for any rendition of the piece.

The four string parts provided for Billings' "America" are sufficient for a simple string orchestra, with or without chorus. However, since these parts follow the vocal parts exactly, they can be used by any four instruments covering the soprano, alto, tenor, and bass ranges—and will be useful to a wide spectrum of orchestra sizes and skill levels.

Gilmore's "Norwich Cadets."

In Gilmore's time the E^{b} cornet was always used as a lead instrument. It is suggested, therefore, that you try to have a player for that instrument; if you don't, the arrangement is cued so that the part may be played by B^{b} cornet.

Gilmore did not use the lower woodwinds found in today's bands, and these parts may be considered as optional in the Celebration arrangement.

Baker's "Soul of '76."

Included with the arrangement of this piece for stage band are a set of lead lines with chord symbols—one set for each of the three major themes in the trilogy. The lead lines are presented for Concert instruments (Bass and Treble clef), B^b instruments, and E^b instruments. This has been done so that your jazz and blues and folk and rock groups —officially sanctioned or otherwise—can "arrange" the themes to fit their needs in whatever style they favor at the moment.

Hewitt's "The Battle of Trenton"

This new arrangement of "The Battle of Trenton" represents the first time that a complete version of the delightful, historic piece has been available; it is the first and only published band arrangement.

Since the entire work is of considerable length, the bandmaster may wish to make appropriate cuts. The following sections of the work are given by the composer:

I. Introduction: Army in Motion-General Orders-Acclamation of the Americans—Drumbeat to Arms (1:45). II. Washington's March (1:45). III. Crossing the Delaware-Ardor of the Americans at Landing (2:00). IV. (a) Trumpets Sound the Charge; (b) The Battle: Defeat of the Hessians Flight of the Hessians—Begging Quarter-The Fight Renewed-General Confusion (3:25). V. The Hessians Surrender Themselves Prisoners of War-Articles of Capitulation Signed (1:45). VI. Grief of the Americans for the Loss of Their Comrades Killed in the Engagement (2:20). VII. Yankee Doodle—Quickstep for the Band (2:00). VIII. Trumpets of Victory-General Rejoicing (3:35). (Total playing time: 18:35).

Kilpatrick's "Romanza".

The solo line in this composition may be played by solo flute, clarinet or violin —making it more practical for groups whose oboists might not have arrived at this level of solo performance. An optional piano part and a few notes for a string bass at the close have been added to make the piece suitable for a string orchestra. In effect, then, the work may be performed by a string quintet, by a solo instrument with strings or piano, or by the orchestra.

Other sources.

A final consideration: you may wish to go beyond the Bicentennial Musical Celebration in searching out appropriate music. JCPenney asked commercial music publishers to list up to ten of their best Bicentennial-oriented titles, now published or about to be. All the replies received are listed here.
