The music is of a quality not likely to have been achieved by someone who dabbled in music this one and only time. All the music elements are in place, melodies, harmonies, counterpoint, articulations, phrasings, dynamics. The scoring shows skill in handling the instruments well beyond the novice stage. All of this leads to the inevitable conclusion that Burte C. Ruby was actually an established composer who chose to not reveal his identity.

About the Music

The Chaser – was published by Albright Music Company in 1904 as a march and two-step. From the title to the music itself, this piece is firmly in the realm of circus galop and that is how it is treated in this new edition. Editors John Bentley and Bill Park have removed inconsistencies found in the 1904 edition, including articulations, phrasings and dynamics to bring them into line with modern publications. The Chaser is a worthy addition to BandMusic PDF Library and to any band performance.
